Mincha for the Week 7:40

Dvar Torah by Rabbi Yaacov Marmor

There are two seemingly innocuous pesukim that, according to the Kotzker Rebbe, reveal a secret regarding how Hashem wants us to perform His mitzvos. The first pasuk is in this week's parsha and it says: וּשְׁמֵּרְתֶּם אֶתִּם הָאָדָם וְאֶת־מִשְׁפֶּטִי אֲשֶׁר יַעֲשֶׂה אֹתָם הָאָדָם וְחַי. You shall keep My laws and My statutes, by the pursuit of which human beings shall live.

The simple meaning of the pasuk is that by performing the mitzvos Hashem grants a person eternal life. However, the Kotzker Rebbe learns that Hashem is actually telling us how to perform His mitzvos and not just the result of performing His mitzvos. He explains that Hashem wants our mitzvos to be done with excitement, vitality, and energy. The mitzvos should be done with life!

The pasuk is telling us that Hashem wants us to live His mitzvos (חַחִי בַּהֶם), not just to do them. The emotional connection to a mitzva is just as important as the mitzva itself. When a person serves Hashem with joy and vitality, it shows that the mitzvos are where he receives his lifeforce.

The second pasuk is in parshas Behaaloscha and is speaking about Aharon HaKohen and how he carried out the priestly service in the Mishkan. The pasuk says: וַיַּעֲשׁ כֵּן אָהָרֹן, Aaron did so; he mounted the lamps at the front of the lampstand, as Hashem had commanded Moshe.

Rashi on this pasuk comments: לְהַגִּיד שִׁבְחוֹ שֶׁל אַהָרֹן שֶׁלֹא שִׁנָּה, This is stated in order to tell the praise of Aaron — that he did not deviate. The simple meaning of this comment is that by the Torah stating "וַיַּעֲשׁ כֵּן אַהֲרֹן" the Torah is praising Aharon for loyally following instructions and not deviating from what Moshe told him. But the Kotzker reads the pasuk differently.

The word "שְׁנָהּ" can mean to change/deviate, but it can also mean to become old. Thus, Rashi is telling us "אְבָּחוֹ שֶׁל אַהֲרֹן שֶׁלֹא שִׁנָּה", that the Torah is praising Aharon for never allowing his service to become "old". Instead Aharon always did his service with excitement and vitality as if it was the first time.

If we only realize how valuable our mitzvos actually are, we would run to do them, and we would feel exuberance every time we are given the opportunity. When a person becomes "old" in their mitzva performance and performs their mitzvos by rote, it is an indication that they have forgotten how precious their mitzvos actually are. Aharon is praised by the Torah for never forgetting.

If we remember that our mitzvos give us life in this world and the next, and if we remember that we are fulfilling the will of the Creator of the Universe and connecting to Him through our actions, then we will be able to perform them with chiyus and hischadshus.

May we live the Torah that we learn, and may we never become old in our service of Hashem.
