Dvar Torah by Rabbi Yaacov Marmor

At the end of this week's parsha, Moshe is commanded to pass the torch of leadership to his foremost disciple, Yehoshua bin Nun. Hashem commands Moshe to "place your hand upon him...and instruct him in the presence of Klal Yisrael". This was the first instance of "Semicha" (literally: leaning) which set the precedent for rabbinic ordination for all future generations.

But, Hashem also commanded Moshe to transfer a second gift to Yehoshua. He told Moshe to "grant him some of your glory (hod) so that the entire Congregation will listen to him." Rashi says that this glory was the glow that illuminated Moshe's face which he acquired on Har Sinai.

But when it came time for Moshe to actually carry out Hashem's command, he deviated from the exact instructions he was given. Hashem told Moshe to place one hand on Yehoshua, but the pasuk states that Moshe placed *both* hands upon him. What was his reason for placing the second hand?

Rav JB Solevechik explains that the second hand was how Moshe transferred his glory (hod) to Yehoshua. The first hand was to "instruct" Yehoshua, and the second hand was to transfer Moshes' divine glow. But what was this "hod", and why was it necessary to establish Yehoshua as the next leader of Klal Yisroel?

The Rav explains that there are two separate ingredients to creating a leader in Klal Yisroel. One is a clear, comprehensive, and thorough understanding of the Torah and its laws. This was what Moshe's first hand was meant to confer, as it was accompanied by the command to "instruct him in the presence of Klal Yisrael".

The second ingredient is the "Mesorah", which includes an understanding of the Divine Will behind the mitzvos and "the Spirit of the Law". One cannot truly be considered a "Rabbi", a spiritual guide for the Jewish soul, if he has only acquired a technical understanding of the Torah without its spirit.

As The Rav puts it: "One can know the entire maseches Shabbos and yet still not know what Shabbos is". The glow on Moshe's face represented this spiritual dimension of Torah. It was Moshe's soul connection to the Torah and clear evidence that he had accessed the divine spirit of the Law.

In modern terms, this aspect of Torah can only be acquired through *shimush talmidei Chochomim*, practically apprenticing under experienced Torah Scholars. There is so much that must be studied and understood that is beyond what is written on the page. Only through spending hours and hours observing Tzadikim and experienced *talmidei chochomim* can one truly grasp the soul of the Torah and thereby lead the Jewish People.

Moshe understood that this transmission required his second hand to be placed upon Yehoshua so that he could confer this spiritual awareness to his protege. With his two hands, Moshe was able to confer both the Torah and Mesorah to his beloved student.

May we be zoche to accessing both the body and the soul of Torah, and may we merit leaders who have received the spiritual Mesorah from the previous generations.
